



Call for Abstracts | GMRC's EAR Workshop

GMRC's Engine Analyzer and Reliability (EAR) Committee is now accepting submissions for Case Studies, Case Problems, Tutorials and Technical Courses for the 2021 EAR Workshop! By presenting at this workshop, you will have access to experts, analysts and reliability technicians embedded in this industry from across the nation.

The 2021 workshop will take place July 19-21, 2021 during SGA's Natural Gas Connect Event in Louisville, Kentucky at the Kentucky International Convention Center. Abstracts should be submitted to [Mary Savalle](#) AND [Rishi Chauhan](#) by **NO LATER THAN Friday, January 29, 2021** in order to be considered for the event. When submitting your presentation, take time to consider the options presented below and specify which category your topic would be most appropriate for:

CASE STUDY (15-30mins) – The case study presentation showcases a real problem that your company has faced and the company's implemented solution. Real-life, front line examples bring valuable knowledge-sharing opportunities for industry colleagues. (**Presentation expected at 10-25mins w/5mins for questions)

CASE PROBLEM (15-30mins) – The case problem presentation showcases a problematic operating condition that your company has not been able to fit with a solution and/or are looking to improve. The presentation should briefly overview the condition, the experienced issue, attempts already made, etc prior to opening up the forum for feedback. (**Presentation expected at 5-15mins w/15min group interaction)

TUTORIALS (45-60mins) – A tutorial is a more in-depth case study presentation. The extra allotted time is to provide a more in-depth look at issues, concerns and the resolution process. This option provides experienced personnel to demonstrate their expertise to attendees. (**Presentation expected at 40mins w/5-20mins group interaction)

TECHNICAL COURSE (2hrs) – A technical course is a non-commercial technical based presentation. This could include Equipment Basics, Technical Research, etc. (**Presentation expected at 1hr 45mins w/15mins for questions)
