Finances

- The 2011 Year End Estimate (as of October 2011) of receipts over disbursements was a favorable 95,000
 The 2011 summary report can be accessed in the <u>GMRC Annual Meeting Report</u> (slides 41-46)
- The 2012 budget includes an increase in research spending (394,600–2012 vs.191,000–2011). Additional funding for this increase includes an approved annual Membership Dues contribution to research of 4,000 / company, increased net from training, and income from publications
